Wildflower Garden Kit	38 Michigan native flowers selected for all-season showiness. About 13 of our prettiest and most dramatic species in groupings of around three per species.		
Starter Collection	38 native plant basics. Will include 5+ species of native plants, 4 to 8 each of a spring bloomer, a milkweed, a coneflower, an aster, and a goldenrod, plus 2 to 4 decorative grasses or sedges and other species as available.		
Pollinator Garden Kit	38 full-season blooms that are favorites for honey bees, bumblebees, and smaller native bees. Also supports butterflies, moths, and other important pollinators. 11 to 13 native species in groupings of three to four.		
Bird Garden Kit	38 medium to tall native flowers, grasses, and shrubs selected to provide hummingbird nectar, nest material, insects for nestlings, and late-season seeds to support local birds. Typically 13 species in groupings of about three.		
Butterfly Garden Kit	38 native plants that host butterfly caterpillars, provide chrysalis support, and provide full-season nectar for adults. Includes milkweeds for Monarchs. Typically 13 species in groupings of about three.
