PLUGS



What does bareroot mean?

Seedlings that are grown outdoors and grown from seed are barerooted, which means that their roots are separated from the soil when they are to be moved to the planting site.

What does plug mean?

Seedlings grown in pots or blocks are containerized seedlings or plugs; they are moved to the planting site in the soil in which they were grown and planted with the soil still attached to the roots.


AGE OF TREES

Barerooted seedlings are described by age class, using two numbers separated by a hyphen. The first number is the number of years the seedling has been in the bed where the seed was sown. For example, a 2-0 seedling is two years old. The second number is the number of years the seedling was in a transplant bed. For example, a 2-2 seedling was in the first bed for two years, then transplanted into another bed where it remained for another two years. A 2-2 seedling is four years old.

Plugs are described by the size of the container they were grown in. Most of our plugs are 4 As meaning that, due to their container size, the root/soil ball is 1"x4". White pine roots grow faster, so they are grown in slightly larger MP45 containers.

HARDINESS ZONES

This map shows the "hardiness zones" for our region. These zones are defined to include a certain range of climatic conditions relevant to plant growth and survivability. This USDA map system is based entirely on average annual extreme minimum temperature in an area and is meant to act as a rough guide. Trees offered in this catalog are generally zoned for Michigan and Wisconsin, however this DOES NOT guarantee tree survival.

This dense slow-growing tree may never be more than a bush on poor soil, but in good conditions can be quite tall. Although Red Cedar appears to produce sky-blue berries, these are actually seed cones with a waxy covering. They are an important winter food source for many birds. The rot-resistant wood is fragrant, light, and durable, making it a favorite for fence posts.

White Cedar is a small or medium-sized tree that grows well in wet forests, being particularly abundant in coniferous swamps. Abundance can be threatened in some areas, as deer find the soft evergreen foliage a very attractive winter food, and strip it rapidly. The light, rot-resistant wood is commercially used for fence posts, lumber, poles, shingles and in log cabins.

The North American fir is celebrated for its rich green needles, natural conical shape, and needle retention. It is notably the most fragrant of all Christmas tree varieties. Balsam firs grow fast, tall, and large when in moist soils mixed with red pines or large hardwoods. In wet swamps, they will grow more and more slender.

A relative of the Balsam Fir, the Fraser is native to the Appalachian Mountain region. This species grows well in sandy loam or more acidic soils. Thanks to its fragrance, shape, strong limbs, and ability to retain its soft needles, this species is a favorite Christmas tree.

Grows best in sandy, well-drained soils and enjoys full sun. This species is fast growing and is favored for its straight growth pattern. Generally used for windbreaks, landscaping, and timber.

The state tree of Michigan! This species can grow in a variety of soils, from dry and sandy to damp upland soils. Long-lived and moderately fast growing. An excellent tree for nesting and roosting birds. Generally used for timber, landscaping and wildlife.

BLACK SPRUCE

Black spruce is a tall, narrow evergreen tree with a spire-like crown. It has descending branches, with beautiful dark, bluish-green needles, and upturned ends. Lower limbs sweep the ground which provides wildlife habitat. It is an excellent choice for wetland situations in cold northern climates.

BLUE SPRUCE

Being the most adaptable of the spruces, this tree is a slow growing, long-lived native of the Rocky Mountain region. It does prefer full sun. Known for its stiff blue-green to silvery needles, it is commonly used for landscaping, Christmas trees, and wind breaks.

A European spruce introduced to Michigan, this tree does well at a variety of sites, but is generally shade-tolerant and prefers rich, moist soils. Often used for windbreaks and landscaping.

As our native Michigan spruce, this tree is slow-growing, long-lived and shade tolerant. It is an excellent tree for pulpwood, saw timber, landscaping, reforestation and Christmas trees.

This unique deciduous conifer stands out in northern swamps with its brilliant yellow-orange color in the fall. This species can grow in a variety of habitats but prefers the moist organic soils of swamps and bogs. Tamarack is very shade intolerant. Commonly this species is used for poles or posts, preferred for its rot resistance. Also a good wildlife habitat species.

APPLE TREES

HARALSON

ZONE 3-6

A biennial bearing fruit tree, Haralson apples have a complex tart flavor that is excellent for fresh eating or baking, and are very good in apple pies. The fruit can be stored up to 4-5 months and it ripens in late September to early October. Haralson's are of low vigor and is easily trained.

FRUIT TREES

APPLE TREES

HONEYCRISP

Zone 4-7

Flavor is sweet but well-balanced. Excellent storage life. Full sun, blooms mid-season, ripens late September. Outstanding variety because of its crispness, flavor, and storage life.

KINDERCRISP

Zone 4-7

Much like Honeycrisp, this variety has exceptional flavor and crisp texture. Features smaller fruit, perfect for snacking, with good balance of sweet flavors. Full sun, blooms early, ripens late August. Fruit is best fresh from the tree.

MCINTOSH

Zone 4-7

A well-known older apple that has a sprightly flavor and a medium storage life. Bright red skin. Heavy bearer. Good for eating and baking. Fruit tends to drop when ripe. Full sun blooms mid-season, ripens late September.

NORLAND

Zone 2-7

One of the earliest summer apples to ripen. Well suited to very cold regions. A natural semi-dwarf and productive tree. Attractive color, small to medium fruit. Good cooking or eating apple. Very hardy. Full sun, blooms early, ripens mid-August.

STATE FAIR

Zone 3-6

State Fair Apple is a medium-sized red striped fruit. Its flavor is sprightly tart and good for eating and baking. State Fair is semi-acidic to sweet and considered an all purpose apple. It is one of the better early apples for northern locations but has a short storage life. Ripens late-August to early-September.

WOLF RIVER

Zone 4-7

An old variety that is hardy and long-lived. Best known for its large sized fruit (up to 5" diameter). Color is pale yellow to green with red blushes and stripes. Primarily used as a cooking wildlife apple. Ripens late-September.

ZESTAR!

Zone 3-7

Zestar! Apples are a hybrid apple cultivated in Minnesota. These apples are known for being early to ripen, late August-early September. Their sweet-tart fruit packs a punch with a subtle hint of brown sugar. Zestar! Apples have been conditioned to withstand the cold, harsh winters of the north. These apples are great for cooking or fresh eating, and can store up to 2 months in the refrigerator.

All apple trees, besides crabapples, need a pollinator of a different variety to produce fruit.

CHERRY TREES

EVANS BALI

Zone 3-8

Evans Bali Cherry is a sweeter "sour" cherry. This cherry tree blooms early in the season, produces 1" dark red fruit in August, and is self-pollinating. Evans Bali is great for baking or fresh eating.

CRABAPPLE

CHESTNUT

Zone 2-7

Pleasant nut-like flavor. Large crabapple (2" diameter). Outstanding flavor and good texture for fresh eating. Medium storage life. Hardy. Full sun, blooms early, ripens late August.

WHITNEY

Zone 3-7

Fruit is yellow with red stripes. Good for eating and pickling. Hardy, vigorous, heavy bearing tree. Short storage life. Full sun, blooms early, ripens August.

PEAR TREES

PATTEN

Zone 3-7

Patten Pears are a great pollinator for most other pear trees. Its fruit is a good size and quality, tender and juicy!

PIPESTONE

Zone 3-8

Pipestone Plums have a very attractive red plum with a goldenblush. Its sweet, juicy, yellow flesh is of excellent quality and good for fresh use, jams, and jellies. Pipestone Plums are a very hardy plum.

A medium to large shrub which, under good conditions, can seem like a small tree. Often multi-stemmed with long outward growing branches forming a dense spreading or spherical shape. Produces edible nuts that attract wildlife. It adapts well to various soils, but does best with well-drained loams and full sun.

Prefers a rich moist soil and the borders of swamps, but can flourish in drier, rocky habitats as well. The berries are eaten by numerous species of birds (such as grouse) and small mammals, while deer happily browse the buds and stems.

Arrowwood is an upright multi-stem shrub with delicate white flowers. Its blue berries persist into the winter and provide important wildlife food. Arrowwood leaves turns a beautiful yellow-red color in the fall.

Beaked Hazelnut is the native hazelnut to our area. This shrub is dense and mound-shaped, with yellowish-brown catkins that are showy in later winter and early spring. Its fall colors vary from bright yellow to a deep wine-red. A member of the birch family the Beaked Hazelnut has protein rich nuts that are a favorite for red squirrels and chipmunks. It also is great for ruffed grouse, pheasant, woodpeckers, and blue jays.

An adaptable shrub with a wide tolerance to a variety of soils and moisture conditions. This species is typically used for erosion control, windbreaks and in excessively wet soils. The high-antioxidant fruit is used in baking and to make jams, jellies, and more. Fruit persists into winter and serves as a food source for birds and other wildlife.

This shrub is commonly found in swamps, roadside ditches, and along shorelines. It develops flat-topped white flower clusters that produce purplish black fruits. This serves as an important forage for wildlife. It performs best with low competition from other woody plants and in full sun to light shade.

Common Chokecherry is a small to large suckering shrub. With its dainty white flowers and dark, edible, purple fruit, this shrub is good for windbreaks, wildlife, and wine. Common Chokecherry also colonizes.

A hardy shrub that is suitable in most soil types but prefers well-drained moist sites. Will tolerate some shade. Lacy flat-topped clusters of white flowers develop into red fruit. Noted for attracting wildlife, especially birds who seek out the berries, which often remain through mid-winter.

Large shrub to small tree known for its dark green leaves and maroon fall color. Typically found along woodland edges. Edible blue berries in the fall are attractive to wildlife. Full to partial sun and medium to wet soils are preferred by this shrub.

Ninebark is a cold hardy, tough, native shrub for mixed borders. Prefers full sun to partial shade and well-drained moist soils but is tolerant of many soil types. Seed capsules are persistent and attractive to birds.

A large, erect shrub best suited where the background, such as evergreens, will show off the dark red winter stems. Besides attractive, red stems in the winter, it has yellowish-white flowers in late May, and bluish-white fruit borne in late summer. Attractive to many species of birds and butterflies. Prefers moist to wet soils and partial to full sun.

A small dense-branching dwarf crabapple that is covered with pure white fragrant blossoms in mid-May. Characteristics make this plant valuable to multipurpose uses. It can be used in windbreaks and its abundant tiny red fruit attract songbirds.

Medium, multi stemmed shrub with white spring flowers, yellow to red fall foliage, and edible purple fruit. Fruit can be eaten fresh or used in jams, jellies and pies. Excellent wildlife plant attractive to pollinators, birds and other animals. Does best in full sun with moist loamy soils, but tolerates full shade and sand or clay soils as well.

WASHINGTON HAWTHORN

Crataegus phaenopyrum

Washington Hawthorn is a medium rate growing tree that has showy white flowers in bloom and also provides important nectar for bees. This tree has bright red berries that persist into the winter and berries provide great wildlife food.

WINTERBERRY HOLLY

Winterberry Holly is a native deciduous holly, commonly found in wet areas. This upright shrub is relatively slow growing but provides wetland restoration for wildlife and is known for attracting birds due to its brilliant red fruit that persists into the winter. NOTE: There are separate male and female plants.

MAPLE

RED MAPLE

Acer rubrum

A medium-large tree adaptable to a variety of growing conditions. It is often selected as a shade tree and has attractive fall color. Often used for landscaping, wildlife, firewood, or is harvested for use as furniture or musical instruments.

SUGAR MAPLE

Best known for its bright fall foliage and as a primary producer for maple syrup. It is also a desirable timber tree. Sugar Maple is large, shade tolerant, and prefers moderately well-drained soils.

OAK

BUR OAK

Quercus macrocarpa

Available As: 12-18", 1-0/2-0



Bur Oak is a large tree with a massive trunk. It is most commonly preferred as it is Oak Wilt resistant. This slow growing tree is a great food supply to animals and is often sought after for timber harvesting. Bur Oak is a hardy tree that can withstand a variety of conditions. CAUTION: Do not prune oaks from April-July.

OAK

RED OAK

Quercus rubra

Prized as a high-value timber species for lumber, veneer, and firewood. It grows rapidly and is tolerant of many soils and conditions, but prefers full sun. Acorns from this tree are more bitter than other oaks, but still an important food source for wildlife.

SWAMP WHITE OAK

A medium sized, quick growing oak. Typically grows in low lying areas with wetter soils. Often utilized as a popular lumber and landscaping tree, Swamp White Oak is also a valuable wildlife food source.

A long-lived oak that is slow growing and drought tolerant. Prefers dry, upland soils. Acorns are a favorite for wildlife over other oaks. This oak species has shown some resistance to the invasive oak wilt fungus.

Balsam Poplar is a large tree that belongs to the Willow family. This tree is commonly planted in parks, by themselves, or in groupings. Sprouting brilliant green leaves between March and April, it's leaves are a warming yellow in the fall.

BIG TOOTH ASPEN

Populus grandidentata

Bigtooth Aspen is a fast growing large tree that does best when grown in moist fertile soils. This tree has amazing yellow foliage in the fall.

BLACK CHERRY

Prunus serotina

Fast growing tree suitable for a variety of soils. The rich reddish wood is valued for furniture, while flowers and purple-black fruits are critical food sources for birds and other wildlife species.

BLACK WALNUT

Juglans nigra

Highly prized for its wood, Black Walnut is one of the most valuable timber trees in Michigan. It is also an important wildlife and insect food source. It prefers moist, sandy-loam soils.

PAPER BIRCH

Betula papyrifera

Best known for its thin, peeling bark, this short-lived species is often used for pulpwood or firewood. It is an early colonizer of burned areas and the bark, seeds, and seedlings are an important dietary component for deer and many other birds and small mammals.

QUAKING ASPEN

Populus tremuloides

Fast growing and spreads primarily through root sprouts, creating clonal colonies. Grouse rely on the winter buds of aspen and stands provide excellent habitat for many game species. Aspen helps improve soils which allows maple, white pine, and balsam to gradually move into aspen stands.

BERRIES

BLUEBERRY, PATRIOT

Berries ripen early. Fruit is large and has good sweet flavor. The bush is vigorous. Patriot Blueberries need 6 hours of daily direct sunlight. Zone 3-7; 12-18" stalk; Available As: Single Plant

GRAPE, KING OF THE NORTH

King of the North Grapes are disease free and extremely vigorous. This hybrid cultivar has medium sized fruit that produces high yields. Fruit will produce in mid-September and is quite tart until dead ripe. Its full flavor is outstanding for juices and jellies. King of the Norths like average, well drained soil with full sun. Zone 4-8; Yr 2 No. 1; Available As: Single Plant

RASPBERRY, MAMMOTH

Mammoth Red Raspberries are sweet fruit bearing plants that have juicy berries. This raspberry is great for jams, desserts, or freezing. Thriving well in well-drained soils and sunny locations, these self-pollinating raspberries, with thorn-less canes, are a great addition to any garden.

FRUIT/VEGGIES

BERRIES

RASPBERRY, PRELUDE

Prelude Raspberries are considered the earliest ripening summer red raspberry. Sprouting fruit in mid-June and again in the fall, its largest crop is produced in the spring. This raspberry is very winter hardy and produces fruit 1-2 years after planting. Bursting with sweet juicy flavor, Prelude Raspberries are great for desserts or jams. This self pollinating fruit likes well drained soils and full sun.

Zone: 4-8; Yr 1 No. 1 (3/16"); Available As: Bundle of 5

STRAWBERRY, ALL STAR

All Star Strawberries is a high yielding sweet, very large, and extra juicy strawberry that produces mid-season. It's harvest season lasts over a few weeks which makes this strawberry a great choice for freezing or cooking to make preserves. All Star's are wonderful candidates for container planting or raised beds and does best in full sun. This strawberry is disease resistant to verticillium wilt, leaf scorch, powdery mildew, red stele, and tolerates botrytis rot.

Zone 3-7; June bearing; Available As: Bundle of 25

STRAWBERRY, EARLIGLOW

Earliglow Strawberries have very flavorful, medium sized berries that produce excellent yields in mid-June. Their crop produces over several weeks and is excellent for fresh eating, processing, and freezing. This self pollinating strawberry is resistant to red stele, root rot, and verticillium wilt. Earliglows do best in average soils with full sun.

VEGGIES

ASPARAGUS, JERSEY SUPREME

An early season, high yield variety. Cold hardy and disease resistant. These asparagus do best in full sun and well drained soil.

Zone 4-8; 2 Yr; Available As: Bundle of 10

ASPARAGUS, MARY WASHINGTON

Mary Washington Asparagus are a strong growing, outstanding variety. This asparagus produces large, green, and rich stalks that are rust resistant. Asparagus plants need room to grow, so make sure you plant them in an area that they can flourish. Mary Washington needs well drained, moist soil and full sun.

WILDFLOWERS

DRY SOILS

BUTTERFLY WEED

Asclepius tuberosa

Butterflyweed has vivid orange flowers that attract butterflies and hummingbirds. This brilliant perennial is also deer resistant. Does best in full sun to partial shade.

COMMON MILKWEED

Asclepius syriaca

Common Milkweed has a fragrant pink flower that attracts Monarch butterflies. This perennial flower colonizes and is a great pollinator. Does best in full sun.

Container Size: 2.5"; Available As: Single Plant

EARLY GOLDENROD

Solidago juncea

Early Goldenrod make a great flower for late season gardens, prairies and meadows. Their golden yellow flowerhead adds wonderful color and texture. This perennial is deer resistant. Make sure to deadhead spent flowers to avoid self-seeding. Does best in full sun to partial shade.

HAREBELLS

Campanula rotundifolia

Harebells has dainty blue flowers above basal foliage. This perennial may be delicate in appearance but is a tough plant. Harebells is also deer resistant. Does best in full sun to partial shade.

NEW ENGLAND ASTER

Symphotrichum nova angliae

New England Aster has daisy like purple/pink flowers that bloom even after frost. This perennial is a great choice if you want to attract birds or butterflies. New England Asters are also deer and rabbit resistant. Does best in full sun to partial shade.

DRY SOILS

ROUGH BLAZING STAR

Liatris aspera

Rough Blazing Star has a unique purple flower. This perennial thrives in dry soil and attracts Monarch butterflies. Does best in full sun to partial shade.

Container Size: 2.5"; Available As: Single Plant

SPREADING DOGBANE

Apocynum androsaemifolium

Spreading Dogbane has a pale pink flower and is part of the Milkweed family. This perennial herb attracts a variety of pollinators and is insect pollinated. Does best in partial shade.

Container Size: 2.5"; Available As: Single Plant

WILDFLOWERS

GRASSES-SEDGES-FERNS

BLUE JOINT GRASS

Calamagrostis canadensis

Bluejoint Grass is the most common marsh plant. This clump-forming grass has many slender stems that arise from small rhizomes; each topped by a large, slightly nodding, branched inflorescence. It shows a purplish tinge when in flower and becomes tan later in the season. Bluejoint Grass stands up well in the winter. Can do well in full sun to full shade.
